Department of Canadian Heritage

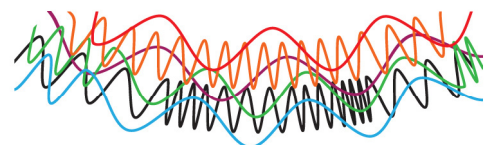
